

# INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM (ISP) POLICY

#### **Policy & Guidance**

- The International Student Program School Toolkit (Guidance tab) provides a plain-language interpretation of all International Student Program policies, procedures and legislative requirements that schools need to follow in response to typical situations that arise throughout the life cycle of an international school student engaged in study in a Victorian government school.
- All forms and templates necessary for schools to use in their daily operations to comply with their ESOS obligations can be accessed in the Resources tab.
- An 'educational resources' section is provided in the Resources tab for each section to support schools' understanding of key ESOS requirements. Further support is available to schools through dedicated school support staff within the International Education Division.
- Schools must:
  - adhere to all mandatory (must do) policy as outlined in the International Student Program (ISP) School Toolkit
  - adhere to all prohibited (must not do) policy as outlined in the ISP School Toolkit
